## Fact Sheet Steps for Cleaning and Disinfecting Foot Baths

To prevent the spread of bacteria and fungus, foot baths must be cleaned and disinfected using the following procedures:

## A. After each client:

- 1. Drain the foot bath completely.
- 2. Wash foot bath basin with detergent and water and use a brush to remove dirt. Rinse with water.
- 3. Refill foot bath with lukewarm water just above the jets.
- 4. Add a disinfectant approved by the manufacturer to the water in the foot bath. If using 5% household chlorine bleach, add 6 tablespoons of bleach for each gallon of water in the foot bath (90 ml to 4.5 litres).
- 5. Activate jets and flush for a minimum of 10 minutes.
- 6. Drain the foot bath.



## B. At the end of each day:

- 1. Using a screwdriver, remove the screen from the foot bath basin. Remove the drain plug. Clean the screen and drain plug with detergent and a brush.
- 2. Soak the screen and drain plug for 10 minutes in a solution of 1 teaspoon of 5% household bleach for each cup of lukewarm water (5 ml to 250 ml).
- 3. Replace screen and drain plug.
- Refill foot bath with water just above the jets. Add 2 or 3 tablespoons of low sudsing detergent, turn on the jets, flush for 5 minutes, drain and fill again with clean water to rinse out the detergent. Drain.
- 5. Refill foot bath with lukewarm water just above the jets.
- Add a disinfectant approved by the manufacturer to the water in the foot bath. If using 5% household chlorine bleach, add 6 tablespoons of bleach for each gallon of water in the foot bath (90 ml to 4.5 litres).
- 7. Activate jets and flush for 10 minutes
- 8. Drain the foot bath and dry.

**Do not** use oil-based products in the foot bath or on the client's feet or legs before they use the foot bath. Oil will build up in the recirculation lines and provide a breeding ground for bacteria.

Never mix chlorine bleach with ammonia products. The combination produces toxic chlorine gas.
